#### SO WHAT? NOW WHAT?

After a long, snowy winter, most of us were grateful for the arrival of spring-bringing longer days, sunshine, and the first daffodils bravely pushing their heads through the cold earth. An old myth says that on the spring equinox, the day when light and darkness are equal in length, it is possible to balance an egg on end. The egg, a universal symbol of fertility and rebirth, has long been associated with the beginning of spring.

Appropriately, this is the time when Christians throughout the world celebrate Easter. During Lent, I drove by a nearby church with a huge sign in front reading, "CHRIST IS CRUCIFIED." Every time I passed by, I thought to myself, "That's not the end of the story." Long after the chocolate chicks are stale and only a few undiscovered Easter eggs remain in the yard, we look at the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus and ask ourselves, "So what? Now what?"

In Unity we sometimes say we don't just believe in Jesus; we believe Jesus. Jesus told us, "You are the light of the world." He taught that the kingdom of heaven is within, and that the things he did, so we could also do. Jesus did not say, "Worship me." He said, "Follow me." Jesus fully expressed the eternal Christ, the individualized Godness in us all. Resurrection follows cruxification, and resurrection symbolizes the reawakening of the eternal Christ consciousness. The "now what" is the call for each one of us to accept and live from our Divine identity.

I remember my third grade teacher who -- when she was displeased with us (actually that was most of the time) -- used to put her hand on her hip in that triangle of power, glare down over her glasses, and scream, "Just who do you think you are?" Trust me, "I am a Divine being" was not the answer she was seeking! Still, it's a compelling question. Who do we think we are?

When we understand that we are spiritual beings having a human experience, we see the problems and challenges of this world differently. We turn within to all the powers of the Christ and live our lives in a consciousness of oneness. We focus on our Divine inheritance of innate wholeness, and our lives become more joyful. We realize we were born in original goodness, and we draw ourselves to ever-unfolding good. We see the goodness even when it is not immediately apparent. Our lives become richer, fuller, and more meaningful because as within, so without.

As Linda Martella-Whitsett writes in the book Divine Audacity, "We recognize the Infinite Self by its effects: our inner peacefulness, joyfulness, and well-being; our broader perspective of oneness existing beyond time and space; and giving ourselves fully into life."

And so it is! And guess what? Snopes.com reports that standing an egg on its end is something just about anyone can do any day of the year; the feat simply takes the right egg and a little practice. Imagine that. So what? Now what?



## Planning your next trip?

Here is a way to earn money for the church when booking it at no cost to you!

It is so simple. I just booked a hotel in Cincinnati for 2 days and earned \$7.60 for the church!! And, I still will get my hotel award points. Follow these simple steps.

- 1. Enroll with IGive. Go to IGive.com and complete the form. Search for "First Unity Church of St. Louis" when asked for your school or nonprofit.
- 2. Install the IGive button on your browser. This will ensure the church gets credit for all future purchases.
- 3. Search for your hotel and rental car, book, and earn money for the church.

Just about every major hotel, rental car chain and discount travel sites are in the IGive network. Best approach is to determine your trip needs, then go to IGive.com and enter your hotel and rental car choices. For example, we always use Hilton so we enter Hilton Hotel and Resorts in the Search Box. The website provides a list of options and how much they will contribute to our church. Pick one and it will take you to their website where you can sign in if you are a member and proceed to book your trip and earn money for our church!! This also works for all online shopping. Just about every online store is part of the IGive network. But always check the "Details" because some stores and hotel chains have exceptions.

Also, don't forget about using EScrip (EScrip.com) when shopping at Schnucks or dining at certain restaurants. My wife loves the dining out option; "It's a win/win; I don't have to cook and my church benefits!"


Community Service & Outreach

The ministry's kick-off meeting was held on July 10, 2018. Our purpose was to discuss and plan for a complimentary luncheon at the church to encourage support for local Community Service Agencies with which First Unity has partnered: Circle of Hope, Feed My People, All the Babies of Eastern Missouri Chapter of Newborns in Need, Neonatal Intensive Care Unit at Mercy Hospital, Vision for Vets, and South County 4th Precinct Neighborhood Resources.

Invitations were provided to congregants and to the greater community, and the luncheon was held on September 8, 2018. Approximately 40 guests attended despite inclement weather. The room was beautifully decorated, the lunch provided was tasty, and the speakers were heartfelt and touching.
